

Moral Development at St Nicholas

The school has a clear and consistent behaviour policy which makes them accountable. Children have written their own class rules which has been shared with parents. The home: school agreement is updated annually.

We have a comprehensive PHSE curriculum (based on Learning 4 Life). Circle times help distinguish between right and wrong and enable children to express their views.

Our assembly timetables and themes discuss a range of issues which encourage discussion on fairness and moral dilemmas.

Our whole school house system rewards good choices and behaviours. Children learn the values of 'win or lose'. PE encourages team spirit and collaboration. We regularly work outdoors, both within the grounds and off site encouraging children to consider their place in the wider community and their responsibilities within that.

We have a 'Growth Mindset' environment where children challenge themselves, develop powers of expression and make independent decisions.

The school promotes the principles of fairness through school council, school and class responsibilities and our charity support, which is largely organised by the children. We donate food to the local food bank.

Children and staff are proud of the school environment and respect people's property. We continue to develop links with parents, church and the wider community to extend this through litter picking, gardening clubs, environment day.
